

## ABSTRACT

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Title : The Process Of Irrealis Suffixed Words Formation of Old Javanese and Imperative Suffixes of Modern Javanese

There are many words in the Old Javanese are still found in Modern Javanese. This matter is considerably to be the evidence that the Modern Javanese is the development of the Old Javanese. Not only vocabularies, but also another property of language is still available in the modern Javanese. The so-called term “suffix” such as –*a*, –*en/-nen*, –*ana*, and –*akna/-na* are enriching the characteristic of the Modern Javanese.

This research discusses the process irrealis suffixed words of the Old Javanese and imperative suffixes in the Modern Javanese. The understanding and virtue of morphology becomes the main approach in this research yet also supported by syntax analysis. Morphological analysis is used to identify and to understand the process of words formation with suffixes in the Old Javanese and Modern Javanese. Meanwhile, syntax analysis is used to explain how suffixed words employed in sentence level.

Based on morphological analysis, the words formation in both languages occurs differently. In the Old Javanese, it occurs two times. Meanwhile, in the Modern Javanese only occurs once. Furthermore, at syntax level, it is found that the forming components of irrealis suffixed words of both Old Javanese and Modern Javanese are the same.
